ORANGE COUNTY CHAPTER SONS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION GENERAL MEETING

October 11, 2014

The meeting was called to order by President Dan Shippey at 11:30am. The Invocation was given by Rev. Lou Carlson. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Danny Cox. The SAR Pledge was led by Mike Shanahan.

We recessed for lunch at 11:35am.

We reconvened at 12:20pm.

Hammond Salley introduced our speaker by reading his biography to us on Richard Suttie and his topic for the day was the "Life of Louis Zamperini. Mr. Suttie showed us interviews he conducted with Mr. Zamperini several years ago. He was a runner in the 1936 Olympic who was asked to meet with Hitler. He was a WWII bombardier. When he was shot down he survived at sea for 47 days until he reached an island which was controlled by the Japanese and became a prisoner of war at that time.

Upon his return home Mr. Zamperini found he had not been registered as a POW and was not registered with the Army as being alive until that was changed when he was 91 years of age. Mr. Zamperini wrote a book called "Devil at My Heels". He went to Japan for the Nagano Olympics and carried the torch along the route to the stadium. He met some Generals in Japan and was able to visit a memorial to the Prisoners of War the Japanese had erected.

Mr. Suttie was presented a Certificate of Appreciation by President Shippey for speaking to us today. President Shippey announced that our Founder of the Day was Polish Freedom Fighter Casimir Polaski. He was a Polish nobleman who fought for American Independence. He is known as the Father of the U. S. Cavalry and is one of only 7 foreigners to be granted honorary U.S. Citizenship.

The minutes from the September meeting were brought up for approval. Jim Blauer noted two corrections where the word Chaplain was misspelled. Lou Carlson moved that we accept the minutes as corrected. This was seconded and approved.

Treasurer Arthur Koehler announced we have \$3,397.21 in the checking account. We took in \$45 in the Ben Franklin Raffle.

Corresponding Secretary Jim Klingler announced we had 8 new members in September from the Beall family and that brings us up to a total of 113 members.

Chancellor John Dodd spoke on the meeting in Louisville last month. They have gone from building the building to now building the museum. There is a new capital campaign to raise money by selling square feet of the museum to members. The price per square foot is \$1,776.

A Patriot Guard was in full force, JROTC was present as well as a bugler, firing detail, and a piper. There was also a pass in review. His sister and daughter attended the service.
