GENERAL MEETING

November 12, 2016

The Founder of the month was Peter Harris. He was born in 1757 and after his parents died he was raised by the Catabwa Indians. He was the only person from the Catabwa Tribe to serve in the American Revolution. He served as a Captain. In 1818 he received an \$8.00 pension from Congress. He also received \$60/ year from the state of South Carolina. His quote of the day was once again by George Washington.

President Ferris noted several important dates for the month of November and the American Revolution.

In honor of our veterans this Veterans Day the armed forces medley was played and those from each branch were asked to stand. This included the Merchant Marines which one of our members served in. They were founded on June 12, 1775 when the HMS Margarita revolted when privateers interrupted the British supply lines.
