SPEAKER TIM CORBETT

Tim Corbett is our guest speaker for September. He is currently the Deputy Director of Facilities O & M and Utilities for the County of Orange, Public Works Department. Tim will be talking about Strategic Planning for capital improvement projects at the County's Central Utility Facility that was converted to a 10.4 MW Co-generation facility in 2010 and provides all electric power, heating & cooling to all County & some Santa Ana City & State facilities in the

Santa Ana Civic Center. His Bio & power point presentation are attached below. Tim was given a medical retirement from the US Marine Corps after 5 years of service for an injury he sustained on active duty here in the US.

At present Tim holds a position with the Orange County Public Works department as the Deputy Director of Facilities O/M & Utilities. This means he responsible for their real estate portfolio and creating a county wide sustainable energy plan.

Tim started his career at the County in 2010 as the CUF and Utilities Manager, working for Gus Fischer. "He had the job that drew me into Public Service".

Tim is originally from Louisiana where he began working at an early age in the family business; Corbett Electric, an electrical contractor designing & building industrial plants such as Cotton Gens and Lumber Mills. After High school and time at the local U Tim decided he wanted to be a Marine and take his life on a distant course. "Marines, the tip of the spear, is where I decided to be in pursuit of being in service to something greater than myself as I had no greater personal vision for myself, still a boy".

After about 5 year into his service Tim suffered an accident while working with EOD to clear ordnance from a training area used to prep troops for deployment to IRAQ. There after Tim was medically retired and made his home here in California where he went back to what he knew best, energy.

In the mid 1990's Tim built his own commercial electrical & HVAC Compa-

ny focusing on Hospital, Hotel and Convention facilities. His career there took a broader growth to managing these types of facilities working for Aramark. Tim's last position before joining the County of Orange was with the Ritz Carton Hotel Company. Tim was the Director of Operations and Engineering for properties located in the Caribbean.

"The Caribbean is a beautiful place to build a resort but you've got to know how to keep the power on and the utilities working or you'll find yourself there alone." The Ritz hired Tim because he knew how to make power and building efficient infrastructure.

Tim saw the opportunity at the County for managing the CUF as more than another job making energy, it was a job in service of something greater. At the County, Tim works to empower people's understanding that the world of energy is something we can command for ourselves in our own communities, thereby empowering growth and economic sustainability for our communities.

California Youth Win Major National Awards at Sons of the American Revolution's 127th Annual Congress

Knoxville, TN — California youth won three major national contests at the 127th Annual Congress of the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution.

Taryn Murphy, an 18 year old recent high school graduate from Temecula, CA won the National Rumbaugh Oration contest with her speech entitled "Why our right to privacy insures national security."

Murphy wowed the national judges with her eloquent defense of the Fourth Amendment and her polished speaking skills. She received a standing ovation from the over 600 attendees and was awarded \$5,000 from the National So-

ciety. Taryn is a nationally ranked public speaker who will be attending Hillsdale College in Michigan.

Kailee Mark, an 8th grade student from Fontana, CA, won the Sgt. Moses Adams Brochure contest. Kailee's brochure was on the Declaration of Independence. This national contest is for 8th grade students, who must produce a brochure on one of our Nation's founding documents.

Vincent T. Von Tungeln, a 5th grade student in Lancaster, CA won the Americanism Elementary School Poster Contest. His poster was on John Sevier and the Overmountain Men, who won the battle with the British at the Battle of Kings Mountain. Kings Mountain is considered one of the most important battles of the Revolutionary War.

The Sons of the American Revolution traces its roots back to the centennial celebrations of 1876 and was officially organized on April 30, 1889, the one hundredth anniversary of the inauguration of George Washington as our nation's first president. The SAR was conceived as a fraternal and civic society composed of lineal descendants of the patriots who wintered at Valley Forge, signed the Declaration of Independence, fought in the battles of the American Revolution, served in the Continental Congress, or otherwise supported the cause of American Independence. SAR members work to keep America's history alive through outreach education programs in schools.

COMPATRIOT DAVIS R. WINSOR JOINS THE EAGKE RANK MEMBERSHIP

Davis Raymond Winsor is a Junior member of our chapter. He joined with his father Travis.

It was on April 5th that Davis passed his Board of Review, having completed all the requirements for the rank of Eagle Scout. On July 30th at the Marina Park Community Center in Newport Beach, Davis Raymond Winsor with fellow scout, family and friends in attendance received his Eagle badge. Though attempts were made to get SAR members there, we were fortunate that Orange County Compatriot and State President Jim Fosdyck was able to attend this very special event.

Davis joins a respectable list of men who are Eagle Scouts in our chapter. Eighteen (18) of our members have achieved this very special rank, as you can see from the chart in the next column.

Since 1989, the Orange County Chapter under President Jim Blauer began the Eagle Scout program put forth by the National Society.

The SAR program is twofold as there is the Eagle Scout Scholarship Contest and the Certificate of Recognition program.

The Scholarship program is open to all Eagle scouts who have not yet reached their 19th birthday in the year of their application and that they have never won the top prize at National. Today that is \$10,000.

The Eagle Scout fills out the application, pedigree chart and does an essay on a given topic as specified in the instructions.

The first hurdle is to be judged as the chapter winner. The chapter winner's application is sent on to the State Chairman for judging at that level. Finally the State winner's application is sent on to National for judging by the Eagle Scout Committee against all the other state entries. The top three prizes at National are \$10,000, \$6,000, and \$4,000.

Should he not win the top prize of \$10,000, he may apply the next year if he has not yet reached the age of 19 in that year of the application being made.

The other part is the Certificate of Recognition. This certificate, which you can view on page 9, was a program begun in 1989. Since Compatriot Blauer was doing the certificates he kept the name of every Eagle Scout we made a certificate out for. The names come from the scout office with the date of the Board of Review to be placed on the Certificate. The certificates, once readied, are then mailed to the offices and placed in the Eagle Packets for each Eagle Scout along with a letter of Congratulations and brochure on the Scholarship Contest. Davis Winsor is the 13,492nd certificate to be issued to an Eagle Scout from the Orange County Council.

Since it was instituted in the 1970s each candidate for the rank of Eagle Scout is required to do an Eagle Project that will be of benefit to the community.

The title of Davis' project was: "Storage Units and Trail Improvements for Environmental Nature Center." Davis designed, constructed and installed new storage shelving units in a service building supporting this community educational environmental center. This also involved removing, organizing and returning all existing supplies. In addition, Davis cleared approximately 280' of overgrown trail, installing peeler logs to define the trails and to improve the safety of visitors. Also as a result of his fundraising efforts, Davis was able to provide additional supplies for future maintenance and improvement of other trails by the center.

At the time of his Court of Honor, Davis had earned 31 merit badges and was also awarded his Eagle Bronze Palm. It is anticipated that Davis will earn his Eagle Gold Palm in early October.

Our congratulations go out to Davis on this remarkable achievement.


